The presentation of  $\frac{3}{4}$  - 1 hour duration covers:

- Why skin cancer is a problem.
- What skin cancer is and the different types of skin cancer.
- The signs to look for that might indicate a skin cancer.
- Ultraviolet radiation - what it is, where it is.
- Engineering, administrative and personal control measures to reduce UV exposure.
- Issues relating to sunscreen choice and use, types of protective clothing and hats.

Participants are provided with information leaflets about the signs of skin cancer and how to reduce sun exposure in the workplace.

- Facts sheets covering the following topics:
  - Skin Cancer
  - Sunscreens
  - Sun Protection from Clothing
  - Hats
  - Sunglasses
  - UV - what exactly is it?
