

Health and Safety Snapshot Fall from heights - Construction

A few facts on the construction industry

In 2020:

Residential Construction 36 serious injuries (69%) 119 non-complainces (61%)

Commercial Construction 15 serious injuries (29%) 73 non-compliances (37%)


Civil Construction 1 serious injury (2%) 4 non-compliances (1%)

- there were 116 serious injuries reported to SafeWork SA, 45% of these were in the construction industry, the highest of all industries
- there were 196 non-compliances identified in the construction industry associated with working at heights
- workers in the residential construction sector sustained the most injuries and were at most risk of a fall from heights
- 90% of serious injuries occured below 3 metres
- 66% of serious injuries below 2 metres were from a ladder
- 50% of serious injuries between 2 and 3 metres was associated with roof work including roof truss installation
- in 2019-20 the construction industry accounted for 866 ReturnToWork claims, the hightest of any industry and a 34% increase on the previous financial year
- in 2019-20 ReturnToWorkSA claims cost the construction industy over \$4 million, the highest of any industry.

Injury claims

In 2019-20 carpenters and electricians had the highest number of ReturnToWorkSA claims for injuries associated with a fall from heights.
