Enforceable Undertaking: SRG Building (Southern) Pty Ltd

SafeWork SA has accepted an enforceable undertaking by SRG Building (Southern) Pty Ltd in relation to the incident that led to the death of Mr Jorge Castillo-Riffo at the new Royal Adelaide Hospital construction site on 27 November 2014.

Mr Castillo-Riffo was employed by SRG (formerly known as Structural Systems (Southern) Pty Ltd) at the time of the incident.

This undertaking will deliver significant improvements in work health and safety to SRG workers, the construction industry in general and the broader community and has an estimated value of \$911,520.

As part of the undertaking SRG will:

- Design, manufacture and supply early warning devices to be used on elevating work platforms throughout the industry.
- Introduce an annual safety award named after Mr Castillo-Riffo.
- Develop a risk management training package for all its operational workers.
- Present work health and safety sessions to TAFE students.

An enforceable undertaking is a legally binding agreement in which a person or organisation agrees to rectify a contravention or alleged contravention of the *Work Health and Safety Act 2012* to improve work health and safety outcomes and performance. It is an alternative to prosecution.

Enforceable undertakings enable on-site remedies to safety breaches following agreement between the regulator (SafeWork SA), an individual or the organisation.

Following legal advice, SafeWork SA has withdrawn its action against Hansen Yuncken Pty Ltd and Leighton Contractors Pty Limited (HYLC) in relation to the same incident.
